Dear Colleagues,

As I indicated back in December, the future of the South West Development Centre was to be reviewed in the light of the changes within Health & Social Care. Of the 8 regional centres that previously made up NIMHE & CSIP, it is the only one maintained in its original form and, indeed, most of the others have been closed and their work assimilated into other organisations.

The Strategic Health Authority has now confirmed that with the changing roles of SHAs following the clustering arrangements, such as their transitional role in preparing for the NHS Commissioning Board, there will need to be a different approach to development support across the NHS and Social Care. Therefore, it is proposed to close the South West Development Centre as at 31 March 2012.

In the meantime, it will be business as usual in regards to the programmes we are currently working on. We will undertake some work on legacy documents that will continue to be available after March 2012 and we will ensure that those details are available to all in the New Year.

NHS Reform managing the transition

The Barbican, London

The Health and Social Care Bill has sparked a huge amount of debate around the future of the NHS, and the planned reforms have been changed significantly following the government's listening exercise. There is now a particular commitment to integrated NHS services and the involvement of a wider range of staff in their design. The reforms will see PCTs and SHAs abolished, with responsibility for commissioning being handed to GP-led groups, supported by a new national commissioning board, and local health and wellbeing boards. Nurses, specialist doctors and other clinicians will also be involved in making local decisions about the commissioning of care. The focus on locally-run services, with commissioning groups and the health and wellbeing boards, moving away from top-down management, has been widely welcomed. This is considered to be a great opportunity to design and deliver services that truly integrate around individual patient needs. Public Service Events' second annual NHS Reform conference will provide an excellent opportunity to examine the reform agenda and the controversies on the horizon of the developing landscape of the NHS.

The government has made clear its priority of eliminating the structural budget deficit within five years, with the Comprehensive Spending Review outlining funding priorities and emphasising the need for greater efficiency and productivity. At the same time, an agenda of reforms across the public sector heralds a fundamental change in the way public services are delivered. This conference aims to provide delegates with insight into how change can happen, and how it can be successful. Managing change is very complex, and requires strong leadership and excellent programme and project management (PPM) skills. Mitigating resistance to change – through robust risk management, effective measurement and management of benefits, and clear communication and interaction – is vital if progress is to be made.
